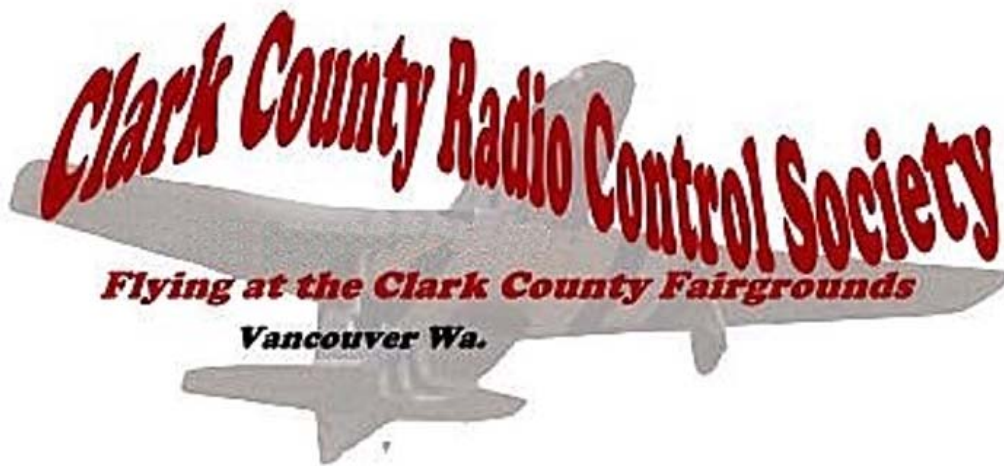

Jerry Holcomb reminded all that Cub Nuts is this coming weekend.

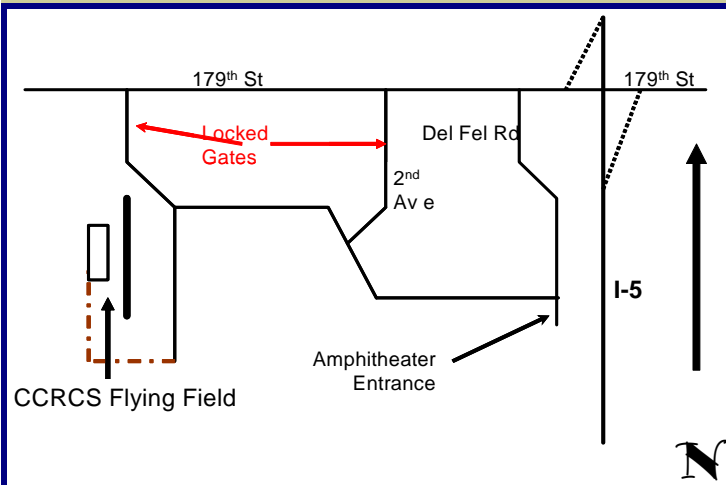
Dave Yardes asked if we could get a broom to sweep the field with. John Shirron said he would get one for us to us.
